## Harvest Food Donations

This year we are going to support the Little Starfish Charity by donating our harvest collection to them. They are a local charity supporting families across Walsall who are facing difficult and challenging times. If you would like to know more information about the charity please ask Andrina.

We would like families to donate **dried goods such as rice and pasta and tinned food**. Our donations will be stored and used to provide healthy meals and food parcels to families. Therefore, they have asked us for **tinned food such as beans, soup, canned meat or tuna and dried goods like rice and pasta**. So, please **NO crisps, biscuits, cakes, chocolate or fresh food**. Can we ask that donations are made by 29th October.



## Children's Cancer Charity

Over the past few year's we have had a number of children who have received life saving treatment at Birmingham Children's Hospital. Last year we raised £1,786 for the children's cancer ward. We would love to raise even more this year, therefore, we will be organising a number of fund raising events throughout the year.

Starting with **Parent Sharing Sessions 16th and 17th October** where the staff will be providing homemade cakes and refreshments, any donations made will added to our fundraising total.

**Plant a bulb for Lukas** We would like to invite parents to join their child in planting a daffodil bulb in the nursery school grounds at the start of their session, on the 3rd, 4th or 5th of October. Family Group leaders will be on hand to help. During the spring, it will be lovely to see how many daffodils flourish to show our support for Lukas and our other families who have been through challenging times. We would like to ask for a donation of £1 per bulb. If every family supports us we will be able to add £200 to our fundraising total.

I would also like to take this opportunity to raise awareness for Lukas' and share an **important message**. Lukas is receiving on going treatment for Leukaemia. The chemotherapy that he receives leaves his immune system open to infection.
